

OVER THE EDGE NW CT: MEET SOME EDGERS

Over 40 people have signed up to rappel 111 feet down Torrington Towers in support of the three partnering non-profits - Prime Time House, the Northwest Connecticut Arts Council, and the Northwest Connecticut Chamber Education Foundation. The "Edgers" are using the summer months to raise a minimum of \$1,000 in donations to their individual page on the Over The Edge NWCT website. The partnering non-profits are hoping to recruit 100 Edgers or Teams of Edgers.



Jeff Geddes, Senior Vice President of Residential and Consumer Lending at Torrington Savings Bank, is going Over the Edge for NWCT. He's an active member of the community serving on several boards. Here is his story about why he has signed up to rappel down Torrington Towers to benefit of the three partnering non-profits:

My initial reaction to rappelling was "No Way!" Then I attended the first Over the Edge information session at Prime Time House and something inside me told me to put my fear of heights aside and take advantage of this once in a lifetime opportunity. I've always avoided heights my entire life but last October, I zip lined at my friend's urging while on vacation and I had the time of my life. The adrenaline rush and feeling of accomplishment is hard to describe but I was able to overcome my fear then and I'm hoping I can again in September. You don't grow if you don't push your boundaries, so I decided to challenge myself and rappel. It goes without saying that I am happy and proud to raise money for Prime Time House, NW CT Chamber Education Foundation and NW CT Arts Council: they all contribute to the quality of life in NW CT but it's more than that. I have a personal understanding of mental health issues having had people I love very much affected; the impact is immeasurable so I'm very excited to support Prime Time House.

Once I put my page up and sent the link out to my friends and colleagues, the donations literally came pouring in. I have a very generous group of friends and business associates. I'm so grateful for all the support both financial and emotional. People that know me, know this is going to be a challenge. They have been very encouraging, so I think all that support makes me want to do it even more. As of now, 38 people have contributed and have helped me surpass my \$2,000.00 goal. I'm currently sitting at \$2,125.00 and I have financial commitments from many others that will make donations before the event. I'll be really thrilled if I hit \$3,000.00.

Besides being scared out of my mind, I'm trying to focus on the fundraising and not thinking about going over the edge. Now when I drive by the Torrington Towers I actually look at the building and talk to it, trying to make friends with it and convincing myself it's not that tall and that I have the courage to do it. I did purchase a costume for the big event but I'm not revealing that until September 16th. I promise it won't disappoint! (https://www.otecwe.com/nwct/jeff-geddes/)

The three regional non-profit organizations will bring their 'fundraising to new heights' with this unique and thrilling event. Partnering with Over the Edge Global, Northwest Connecticut residents will be raising funds and awareness over the next two months to have the opportunity to rappel down Torrington Towers on Saturday, September 16. This unique event, never before presented in Northwest Connecticut, is sponsored by Sharon Hospital, PAC Group LLC, O&G and Health Quest with additional support from Crystal Rock Water, Charlotte Hungerford Hospital, and Litchfield Distillery. It is also made possible through the support of the Torrington Housing Authority.

For the first "Edger" to raise \$5,000, Spirit Ballooning is donating one spot on a champagne, scenic balloon flight from one of their balloon ports in the area. There are other incentive prizes available to encourage individuals to sign-up.

Since 2008, Over the Edge Global has helped non-profits raise more than \$45 million and put 25,000 fundraisers safely 'over the edge'. 



Thomaston Savings Bank

The Town of Harwinton Economic Development Commission recently awarded Thomaston Savings Bank with the 2017 Outstanding Local Business award. Mr. Lewis recognized his employees for their volunteer efforts that helped raise \$6,500 to give back to the town last year. Mr. Criss proclaimed June 27th "Thomason Savings Bank Day" in Harwinton.

O&G Industries, Inc.

O&G Industries has announced the updates on two of their projects. The renovation of Putnam High School in Putnam, CT has been completed. Construction on the \$36.6 million, 98,000 square foot renovate-as-new project began in the fall of 2014 and was completed in the winter of 2017. The scope of the project included replacing windows, renovating science labs, expanding the gymnasium, transforming the existing library into a multimedia center and upgrading the mechanical infrastructure of the 60 year old building.

A five-month project for St. Francis Hospital and Medical Center that saw significant upgrades to its 20-room oncology pavilion and adjoining flex space has also been completed. The new pavilion is part of the Hospital's "Hope & Healing" campaign and places a premium on technology for treatment, amenities for patients and their families, and home-like aesthetics in patient areas. New headwalls at bedsides give patients control over the temperature & lighting of their rooms. The redesign included new private suites where visiting family can overnight, and a spacious healing lounge for relaxation, visits & programming. Renovations included nursing stations, a conference room & staff respite suite.

Charlotte Hungerford Hospital

Ready to quit smoking? We can help! The Charlotte Hungerford Hospital (CHH) is offering FREE admission to its next "Freedom From Smoking" Cessation Program beginning on September 13th from 4 to 5:30 PM. The classes are being held in the Conference Room at the Hungerford Center, 780 Litchfield St., Torrington, just up the hill from the main hospital building.

CHH's FREE Smoking Cessation Program is a series of eight interactive classes over an eight-week period featuring discussion and skills practice. The sessions are led by a trained, certified American Cancer Society facilitator who understands the motivations and rationalizations of smoking, and uses a positive behavior change approach that teaches people how to become a permanent non-smoker.

As a special incentive, the \$75 program fee will be waived for all participants. "Quit Day" is planned for October 2nd. Call 860-496-6538 to register or receive more information. Space is limited.

CHH has opened its new Emergency Department (ED) entrance located in the same location and parking area as the former ED entrance but closer to Litchfield Street. Patients and visitors are now welcomed by two large highly visible red "EMERGENCY" signs at the new entrance and should park in the same area they are accustomed to in the past.

The renovation completes the second phase of the hospital's comprehensive, six-phase, multi-year, renovation and expansion project designed to modernize and enhance the ED infrastructure and services. Also completed and put into operation is a new check-in area for staff members to greet patients and conduct a quick, private evaluation, a larger, more comfortable waiting room, state-of-the-art treatment and triage rooms, and new security, staff, and spiritual care areas.

The ED upgrade project was initiated last year to improve patient privacy and comfort, provide less patient waiting time, improve patient flow and efficiencies, and better accommodate larger volumes and technical advances in patient care. When completed, CHH will have 34 Emergency Department treatment rooms and two triage areas, an updated nurse station, additional equipment and supply storage space, and rooms for nutrition, bariatric, EMS, and financial counseling services.

The CHH Emergency Department is open 24/7 all year and located at 540 Litchfield Street, Torrington, CT. For more information, call 860-496-6650. CHH also offers emergency care at the Winsted Health Center, 115 Spencer Street, Winsted, CT, seven days a week from 9 AM to 9 PM. Winsted ED can be reached at 860-738-6650.


