Free Mental Health First Aid Training: Mental Health in the Workplace

Did you know that you are far more likely to interact with an employee having a mental health or substance use problem than one in need of CPR?

Mental Health First Aid, "CPR for the mind" is an 8-hour certificate training to teach participants how to help someone who is developing a mental health problem or experiencing a mental health crists. The evidence behind the program demonstrates that it helps trainees identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental illness and substance use disorder. Like CPR, Mental Health First Aid prepares participants to interact with a person who is struggling or in crisis, and connect the person with help.

Financial Reality Fair

The 9th Annual Financial Reality Fair took place on April 25th at Torrington High School. Over 700 students from the following schools participated in this year's fair: Terryville High School, Torrington High School, Derby High School, Northwestern Region #7, Oliver Wolcott Technical School, Farmington High School, Wamogo Regional High School, Housatonic Valley Regional High School, Highlander Transitional Program, Torrington Christian Academy, Litchfield High School, Glenholme School, and Thomaston High School.

The Chamber partners with the Connecticut Credit Union League and Northwest Hills Credit Union to provide this hands-on budgeting experience to high school students. Participating students gain practical knowledge about personal financial management in a one day "real world" environment.

The Financial Reality Fair is a 4 hour (approximate time), hands on experience where students, after identifying their career choice and starting salaries, are provided a budget sheet requiring them to live within their monthly salary while paying for basics such as housing, utilities, transportation, clothing and food. Of course, there are many temptations for additional spending and students must learn to balance their wants and needs to live on their own. After they have visited all the booths, students will balance their budget, and then sit down with a financial counselor to review their standing. The Fair is a unique opportunity for each student to experience some of the financial challenges they will face when they start life on their own.



The class' May session will be their class trip to the Yard Goats game in Hartford where they'll get a behind-the-scenes tour and learn about the impact the team is having on Hartford and get to enjoy the game and lunch from the Luxury Suite.

Group 1 held a Job Shadowing Day for Torrington High School students on April 3rd. Over 75 students visited local businesses for 2 and a half hours of job shadowing. Following their shadowing experience, the students and their hosts attended a luncheon at Chatterley's Banquet Facility where they heard from speakers Mayor Elinor Carbone, JoAnn Ryan, Superintendent Denise Clemons and Northwestern CT Community College President Dr. Michael Rooke.






