Hartford HealthCare Adds a New Primary Care Provider



Housatonic Valley Association



HVA is the citizen's nonprofit conservation organization dedicated to protecting and restoring the natural character and environmental health of the entire tristate Housatonic Watershed for this and future generations.

Because HVA believes that cool, clean rivers, thriving woodlands and healthy habitats must go hand-in-hand with livable and growing communities, we promote smart growth strategies that protect water quality, wetlands habitats, and open spaces for a climate-ready future.

Today we're acting in two fundamental ways to protect our region's environment:

• Follow the Forest, conserving another 50,000-acres of woodland corridor across our region and 100 wildlife pathway linkages, for clean water, habitat and migration, and carbon/temperature moderation. This will secure a connected woodland corridor of 250,000 acres to buffer our villages, towns and cities with clean water, thriving wildlife, and cooler temperatures. • Clean, Cold and Connected, restoring and protecting 500 miles of rivers and streams, and the groundwater that recharges these waterways as well as our local drinking water. This will keep our waters fishable and swimmable, enable fish to swim upstream to spawn, reduce costly flooding, and sustain clean drinking water even as our population grows.

Though ground breaking progress is being made, such as the 2022 Congressional designation of 41 miles of the Housatonic in Northwest Connecticut as a National Wild and Scenic River, the recent restoration of 25 stream miles, and the protection of 5,800 acres of core woodlands, there is a lot of work to do in the next 20 years to secure a clean and healthy environment for our communities.
